

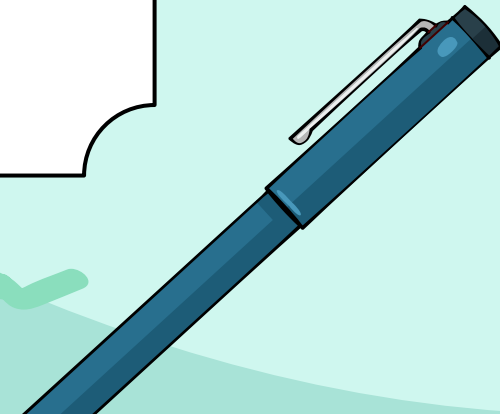

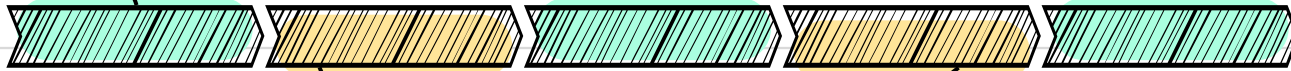

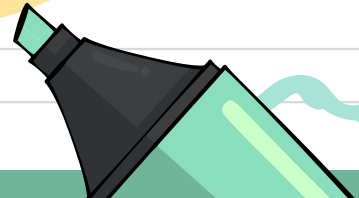


Home Learning

Reading and Phonics



Children will receive two reading books.

The first book is the child's own choice from our libraries. We call this the bedtime story book. It can be read by, to or with the child. It's purpose is to encourage the children to find books and reading a pleasurable experience.

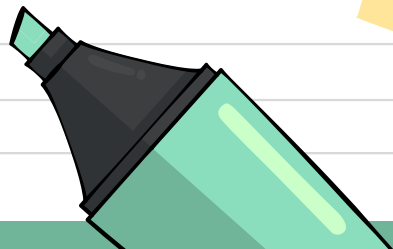
The second book is provided in line with our new Phonics reading programme. The children will have used this book in class with the teacher - they will therefore likely know many of the words. It's purpose is for them to develop their fluency and reading with expression. As the children can read these books they are also useful for practising comprehension skills.

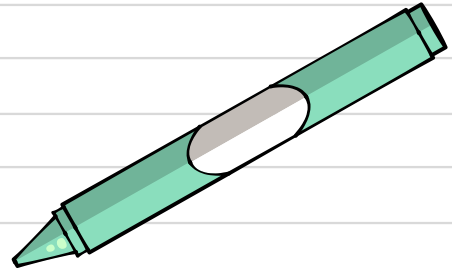




Digital Safety

- No phones are allowed in school.



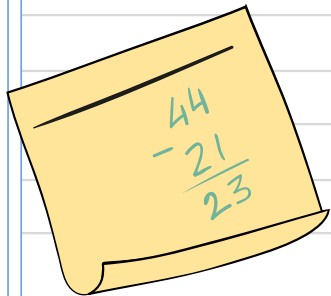
Additional Needs
