


# Sentences

Sentences make sense by themselves. They need at least one main clause. Each clause has an active verb.




They went to battle. The man <u>led</u> the way. His friend is alongside him. His worst fears <u>became</u> reality. Was it his fault?





# Sentences and their Punctuation

We **punctuate** sentences to make our writing clearer. A **capital letter** goes at the beginning and the end is indicated by... a **full stop**, **question mark** or **exclamation mark**.



### Parts of a Clause

A **clause** is a group of words which contains a verb.

The verbs have a subject.




In some **clauses** there is something the verb acts on. This is called the object.

### Parts of a Clause






I remembered the whole thing.


He opened his eyes.
