

## Catch Up Funding Expenditure September 2020

The Secretary of State for Education is providing financial assistance to local authorities for their maintained schools and for pupils that local authorities place in independent special settings, in the form of the coronavirus (COVID-19) catch-up premium for the financial year beginning 1 April 2020.

The Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) paid the first instalment of the catch-up premium to local authorities on behalf of the Secretary of State for Education on 30 September 2020. There will be three tranches of payment.

Schools' allocations are calculated on a per pupil basis, providing each mainstream school with a total of £80 for each pupil in years reception through to 11 based in 2019 Census.
