

Year 4 Autumn 2 Curriculum Overview

Reading

We are following Destination Reader, which focuses on different skills e.g. evaluating, summarising, predicting and clarifying.

Writing

In writing we are looking at how to write historical texts that entertain an audience
We will then be writing effective instructions.

Mathematics

In maths we will be consolidating and developing our place value and number knowledge. We will also be adding and subtracting with numbers up to 4 digits.

History

We will be looking at how life was through the Stone, Bronze, and Iron ages.

Spanish

In Spanish, we will be learning about hobbies and talking and writing about what hobbies we do during different months of the year.

PHSE

We will be learning about how to interact with unknown adults, physical contact and abuse.

Physical Education

Dance - Children are focusing on creating characters and narrative for their journey to a destination through movement and gesture. Children gain inspiration from different stimulus as they work with a partner and small groups.
Tag Rugby - In this Tag Rugby unit the children will learn skills needed to play in both attack and defence. They will learn how to catch and throw while both stationary and on the move, working on their skills of tagging and sidestepping as well as making tactical decisions about when to make passes and tags.

Computing

We will be using logical reasoning to design, write and debug programs and correct errors in algorithms and programs. To achieve this, we will be using sequence, selection and repetition in programs. We will also be learning to use search technology effectively.

Music

In Music, following on from our Black History Month focus, Year 4 will be exploring famous black musicians who have made their instrument popular and have influenced the music world, both classical and more modern. It will support our learning about well-known instruments - their history, how they work and are played, and how to recognise a famous piece of music associated with them. We will also compare, and contrast music connected with Diwali, Hanukkah and Christmas, making discoveries about their key characteristics.

Religious Education

Initially we will be looking at where The Beatitudes came from, what they are and what they mean for Christians. We will then explore what Peace means to Christians at Christmas.
