



What is Phonics?

- Children have 30mins daily discrete phonics lessons;
- Children are taught to read by breaking down words into separate sounds
 or 'phonemes'. They are then taught how to blend these sounds together
 to read the whole word;
- There are around 40 different sounds.

What is the screening check?

- Every Year 1 child in the country will be taking a statutory phonics screening check in the same week in June.
- Children in Year 2 will also take the check if they did not achieve the required result when in Year 1 or they have not taken the test before.
- The check is very similar to tasks the children already complete during phonics lessons.
- The focus of the check is to provide evidence of children's decoding and blending skills, not to test their vocabulary.


What will the children do?

They will be asked to 'sound out' a word and blend the sounds together.

e.g. d-o-g-dog

 The check will consist of 40 words, a combination of real and nonsense(pseudo) words.

Children will be told if the word is a real or 'alien' word,



How will they be tested?

- Teachers will complete the check with the children one to one.
- The children will complete the check in a quiet area of the school.
- We are not allowed to say to the children at the time whether they have correctly sounded out and / or blended the word.

And the results...?

- Children will be scored against a national standard.
- We will let you know if they have met the standard threshold, and all children will receive a certificate for taking part.
- If your child's score falls below the national standard they can re-take the Phonics Screening Check in year 2.

When will it happen?

The screening check will take place throughout the week beginning

June 2020



How can you help?

- Don't panic your child has been learning phonics <u>ALL YEAR.</u>
- Read as much as possible to and with your child.
- Encourage and praise get them to have a 'good guess'.
- If your child is struggling to decode a word, help them by encouraging them to say each sound in the word from left to right.
- Encourage them to use their sound buttons.
- Blend the sounds by pointing to each one, e.g. /c/ in cat, /p/ in pat, /ng/ in sing, /ee/ in been.
- Discuss the meaning of words if your child does not know what they have read.
- Children can practise their phonics by playing games online.
