It has been an incredibly busy start to the new academic year and it is hard to believe that it is half term already. The children have settled really well into their new classes and there is a very purposeful learning climate around the school. The

careful planning from staff and the children's positive attitudes to learning have resulted in many fantastic opportunities for the children to make excellent progress at school. The following few examples are some of the many

highlights: The Big Bad wolf visited our reception classes, so they could interview him about a crime that he had committed in school; Year 4 made working traffic lights as they learnt about their inventor Garrett Morgan; Year 6 took inspiration from William Kamkwamba and their English text, 'The Boy Who Harnessed the



Wind' by designing and making their own self-propelling cars; while Year 5 investigated how size can impact upon the speed of a dropping parachute.



We are delighted that our broad and balanced curriculum has been recognised in a variety of ways this half term. We have won a Music Mark Award from the Brent Music Service for our music curriculum which has included Year 3 learning the cello and viola in their classes (in addition to their weekly music lessons) and Years 4, 5 and 6 learning the steel pan drums. Several recent visitors have also commented on the quality of the children's singing across the school including Bishop Rob who, after delivering mass, tweeted that the children's singing was 'stunning, beautiful and genuine.'



Furthermore, our sports teams have performed very well this half term. Our Year 1 and Year 2 football team won 5 out of 7 games at a local tournament and our tag-rugby team won the Brent Championship last week. This means they will now go on to represent the borough of Brent at the London Youth Games in March 2023! Congratulations to all the children who participated. We are also very grateful to Ms. Domingo from St

Claudine's School for helping us to provide high quality

Spanish lessons for our older children in Key Stage 2.

Our Junior Leadership Team has been interviewed and appointed. Many of our new leaders have started their roles. Our worship leaders were involved in the appointment process for the New Vicar at All Souls this week. Peer mediators have





started their training too.

On 5th October, we welcomed fellowship groups from St Catherine's Church, Neasden and St Gabriel's Church, Willesden to celebrate Mass with us. The multi-generational service was a great success and clearly moved our visitors, who found the children's joy infectious.

Thank you to all of you for all the generous harvest contributions that you sent in. The school celebrated its harvest assembly and the food has now been added to our foodbank. Please let the office know if you would like support from our foodbank or if you are able to volunteer to help with its distribution.

Thank you too for your votes in our recent parent governor elections. Over 400 votes were cast. Jennie Thomas, was re-elected to the Governing Board and Pete Gladwell was newly elected to our Board. We are very grateful to Ahmed Herzi for standing. The governors believe that Dr Herzi has a lot to offer the school and we are meeting with him to see how he can also support the strategic vision and direction of the school.
