



PE and Sport Premium for Primary Schools 2024-2025 (financial year)

At John Keble School we recognise the contribution of Physical Education (PE) to the health and well-being of pupils. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our pupils. Physical Education and sport clearly contribute to the holistic development of young people and through participation in sport and physical education, the pupils learn more about key values such as teamwork, fair play and respect for themselves and others.

There is significant evidence to show the positive effects of sport and exercise on pupils' physical health, growth and development. Furthermore, sport also provides a healthy environment for young people to learn how to deal with competition and how to cope with both winning and losing.

What is the PE and Sport Premium for primary schools 2024-2025?

The PE and Sport Premium is funding for schools to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. Schools are free to manage the spending of this grant in the way that serves their pupils best.

What are the conditions of funding?

Ofsted inspections are expected to report on how primary schools spend their PE and Sport Premium funding. Schools must publish details of how they spend funding on their website.

How much funding can John Keble Primary School expect to receive?

We have received £19,270 in funding for this year.
