-our is Changed to -or before -ous is added. A final 'e' must be kept if the  $/d_3/$  sound of 'g' is to be kept. If there is an /i:/ sound before the -ous ending, it is usually spelt as i, but a few words have e.

Strictly speaking, the endings are -ion and -ian. Clues about whether to put t, s, ss or C before these endings often come from the last letter or letters of the root word. -tion is the most common spelling. It is used if the root word ends in t (invent) or te (hesitate).-ssion is used if the root word ends in ss or -mit.

Strictly speaking, the endings are -ion and -ian. Exceptions: attend - attention, intend - intention. -cian is used if the root word ends in c or cs.



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


